ORDINANCE #10

PURPOSE: TO ESTABLISH RULES GOVERNING RAISING OF FOWL ON THE RINCON RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The Rincon San Luiseno Band of Mission Indians is concerned with the Health, Education, and Welfare of its members, and


WHEREAS, the Band finds that the commercial raising of fowl on the Rincon Indian Reservation is hazardous to the health of the people residing there, and

WHEREAS, such a business operation will deplete the supply of domestic water, that will jeopardize the future growth of members needing water, will cause unsightly damage to the esthetic beauty of the reservation; will create uncontrolled dust; and unbearable odor, flies, noise, and other related grievances

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Rincon San Luiseno Band of Mission Indians that no commercial raising of fowl shall be allowed on the Rincon Indian Reservation, and in any case, not more than twenty-five (25) fowl may be raised by each family residing on the Rincon Indian Reservation, IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Ordinance #10 provides "Whoever, without lawful authority or permission, willfully and knowingly proceeds to violate Ordinance #10 will be liable immediately for any cost to the Rincon, San Luiseno Band of Mission Indians for the removal/storage of said fowl. This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption of the Rincon, San Luiseno Band of Mission Indians, and shall be retroactive to the beginning of January 1, 1975.
